



11th Grade Advanced Placement Language and Composition 2019 Summer Reading Assignment

“AP English Language and Composition is an introductory college-level composition course. Students cultivate their understanding of writing and rhetorical arguments through reading, analyzing, and writing texts as they explore topics like rhetorical situation, claims and evidence, reasoning and organization, and style” (“AP English Language and Composition: The Course/AP Central--The College Board”). Summer work and reading is assigned to help students better prepare for both the rigor and the expectations of this college-level course. This summer, students will read both the US Common Read, *The Fox Hunt* by Mohammed Al Sawami as well as a portion of *Thank you for Arguing: What Aristotle, Lincoln, and Homer Simpson Can Teach Us about the Art of Persuasion* by Jay Heinrichs.
